## From February 2017 to February 2018, Louisiana LOST a net of 200 jobs.



Louisiana was

## one of only four states to lose jobs year-on-year

(the others, North Dakota, Alaska, and Delaware).




#### Any reduction in the unemployment rate came from a combination of:

1) people leaving the workforce and becoming discouraged and/or

2) people *leaving Louisiana altogether* -- exactly the wrong reasons to "celebrate" a lower unemployment rate.

## **GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT**

In the third quarter of 2017,

## Louisiana's GDP grew 1.1%. This ranked second from the bottom

only South Dakota grew at a slower rate.

(By comparison, Texas' 5.0% growth rate ranked second from the top.)

Louisiana's GDP grew only 0.2% in 2016.



## **PERSONAL INCOME**

#### Net earnings (wage growth) rose at only 1.0%

only seven states had a lower rate of wage growth.





Conversely, Louisiana led the nation in the

growth of welfare transfer receipts--those rose 8.3%.
