

HB 293 Foil, Franklin(R) Allows certain certified records to be used as

evidence.

Specific Remarks: This bill is opposed because it is not necessary and has not been reviewed by the Louisiana Law Institute.

**OPPOSE** 

Lobbyist Larry Muray reports: FAILED. While amended in both the House and Senate committees to address most of our concerns, the author ultimately returned the bill to the calendar at the request of the LSBA and passed instead HCR 174 requesting a Law Institute study of this issue.

Provides relative to the Louisiana Governmental

Specific Remarks: This bill is opposed beccause it creates a de facto immunity, which is opposed generally by the LSBA as

per policy of the House of Delegates.

Foil, Franklin(R) **HB 408** 

Revises the business corporation laws.

Specific Remarks: The bill directly affects the practice of law, and would bring Louisiana in line with other states.

SUPPORT

Lobbyist Larry Murray reports: FAILED. The length of the bill and the substantial fiscal impact associated with its implementation resulted in a request from the Senate leadership that the bill be delayed a year.

Provides relative to operating a vehicle while intoxicated as relates to third offense DWI.

Specific Remarks: This bill gives to judges the needed discretion to determine sentence and addresses access to justice issue, as per House of Delegatees policy.

Provides with respect to immunity from liability for volunteer firemen.

Specific Remarks: This bill was originally opposed. Due to amendment, the basis for the opposition has been removed. The LSBA now takes NO POSITION on this bill (5/13/13).

Lobbyist Larry Murray reports: AMENDED AND PASSED. Working with the author, the bill was substantially amended to address LSBA concerns and the LSBA moved to "No Position."

SB 108 Perry(R) Provides relative to an offender convicted of first

degree murder with life sentence.

Specific Remarks: Legislature should not be involved in the administration of visitation and privileges in a prison facility.

**OPPOSE** 

Lobbyist Larry Murray reports: FAILED. This bill failed its initial committee hearing.

**Last Action:** 5-14-13 S Voluntarily Deferred in Committee Senate Judiciary (C)

SB 112 Gallot(D)

Provides procedure for expungement of certain criminal records.

Specific Remarks: This bill is supported because of its beneficial effect on access to justice.

SUPPORT

Lobbyist Larry Murray reports: FAILED. The author did not move this bill.

Last Action: 4-30-13 S Not Heard in Committee Senate Judiciary (C)

SB 166 Claitor(R) Provides relative to consumer litigation loans.

Specific Remarks: This bill is supported because of the positive effects upon the practice of law.

#### SUPPORT

Larry Murray reports: FAILED. Despite significant efforts by the LSBA in support of this bill, it ultimately failed in the House committee.

SB 188

Martiny(R) Lopinto, Joseph(R) Provides for salaries of judges as recommended by

the Judicial Compensation Commission.

Specific Remarks: The LSBA supports this bill because it supports an

adequately funded judiciary.

Lobbyist Larry Murray reports: PASSED. Increases are as follows: Supreme Court Justices (5.5%) Appellate Judges (3.7%); District Judges (4%); then 2.1% in each of the following four vears.

SB 198

Consolidates the functions of the Louisiana Emergency Response Network and the Bureau of Emergency Medical Services into the Louisiana Emergency Medical Services and Response Network.

Became SB 262.

Specific Remarks: This bill was originally opposed. The LSBA now takes

NO POSITION on this bill (5/13/13).

OPPOSE - Subsequently moved to "NO POSITION"

Lobbyist Larry Murray reports: This bill was AMENDED and became SB 262 (see below).

Last Action: 5-13-13 S Set on the Senate Orders

Riser(R) SB 230

Creates the Tax Court to replace the Louisiana Board of Tax Appeals and expands its jurisdiction to local tax matters.

Specific Remarks: The creation of tax courts is opposed because questions remain regarding the appointment of tax court judges and because the juducial council was not consulted.

#### **OPPOSE**

Lobbyist Larry Murray reports: FAILED. The author did not move this bill.

Last Action: 3-29-13 S Referred to Senate Committee on Senate

SB 262 White(R)

Provides for the Louisiana Board of Emergency

Medical Services. Substitute for SB 198.

Companions: SB 198 (Substitute)
